Newsworthy Nicotine: Translating New Regulations into Practice

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has recently introduced several critical regulatory actions intended to reduce the use and addictive nature of combustible tobacco products and Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS). These actions include measures to reduce the use of ENDS in youth, as well as reducing the nicotine content of combustible tobacco products, such as cigarettes. In this session the speaker will review nicotine addiction, ENDS, and discuss how these new FDA regulations could potentially impact nicotine dependence and pharmacy practice.

Application of Pharmacogenomics Guidelines to Improve Medication Efficacy and Safety

Following a brief review of pharmacogenomics (PGx), the sources of PGx guidelines will be discussed. The guidelines will be applied to patient cases to illustrate how PGx impacts drug efficacy and/or safety. Examples will include applications to some of the more commonly prescribed medications.

Kidneys, Kinetics, Drug Dosing – Oh My!

Therapeutic medication selection and dosing for organ function is often an expected clinical duty across many pharmacist practice settings. In 2021, the National Kidney Foundation (NKF) and American Society of Nephrology (ASN) jointly recommended a new equation for estimated glomerular filtration rate (eGFR) to improve screening, evaluation, and monitoring of kidney function in patients. The eGFR is also now frequently used to guide medication selection and dosing, particularly in common and high-impact chronic diseases. This session will review these changes in kidney disease management and include common patient scenarios for application and discussion.
